

Position Title: Youth Program Support Specialist- San Luis Valley
Reports to: Youth Program Manager and Youth Program Coordinator

The Valley to Valley (V2V) Homeschool Program provides meaningful social and extracurricular opportunities for homeschool students across the San Luis Valley through partnerships with local districts.

Position Summary: The Youth Program Support Specialist will assist in the delivery of high-quality youth programming under the guidance of the Youth Program Manager and Coordinator. This role includes supporting weekly activities, occasional field trips, and providing reliable communication with program participants and families. This role is an opportunity to make a meaningful impact on homeschool students by providing enriching and engaging programs in a supportive community setting. The role is designed to accommodate flexible scheduling, with essential programming needs on Tuesdays.

Key Roles and Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with the Youth Program Manager and Coordinator to deliver youth programming.
- Act as a secondary point of contact for families, maintaining consistent communication.
- Address behavioral concerns in partnership with the program leadership.
- Assist in managing transportation needs, including driving youth in AAI vehicles when necessary.
- Support planning and preparation for weekly activities and events.

Desired Knowledge and Skills:

- Experience working with youth in educational or extracurricular settings.
- Familiarity with homeschool communities or mixed-age programming.
- Strong communication, organization, and conflict resolution skills.
- Comfort leading discussions, setting boundaries, and managing group dynamics.

The Valley to Valley (V2V) Homeschool Program serves approximately 80 homeschool students in the San Luis Valley. Through partnerships with the Mountain Valley School District and local organizations, the program offers a diverse range of weekly activities and field trips designed to inspire creativity, build skills, and foster a sense of community.

Students participate in a variety of series, including American Sign Language (ASL), S.T.E.A.M. challenges, performing arts, historical European martial arts, and hands-on workshops like woodburning and cooking. Field trips complement the programming, offering experiences such as skiing lessons at Wolf Creek, tubing at Monarch Mountain, and farm visits.

Family events, such as the annual camping trip and end-of-year celebration, encourage bonding and reflection, creating lasting memories for participants.
